

# Brown Bag Lunch Report

It has been several weeks since the first Brown Bag Lunches were served out of Base 215 for 2023. A total of 1,941 lunches were served by the five churches participating in this mission.



Tuesday was St. John's day and we packed 347 lunches in ten weeks. The 4<sup>th</sup> of July was a Tuesday so we were a week short of the other churches. St. John spent \$490.16 on the lunches. This money was taken from a grant administered by Jenn Thompson and money that was donated this year and a few years ago by the members of St. John. Our cost was kept down because we had the benefit of one less week, some food items left from VBS, and donations of sweets and veggies

from the people who packed lunches. The biggest cost savings was ham from the Green Bean Pantry that lasted for six weeks. Many thanks to everyone, big and small, who packed lunches, donated, or delivered lunches this summer.

#### **Wurstmarkt Pies**

We will again serve only apple and cherry pies to make it easier to fill orders for the Drive-Up Wurstmarkt. Berkemann's Bakery in New Baden will make them and deliver them to us. 
# Rainbow Preschool News
