


Beloved Church Family,

For the last few months, I've been reflecting on some of the spiritual practices, blessings, and lessons I was able to lean into while on my sabbatical last summer. So far, I've talked about organization, balance,

nature, and breath. I have two more areas I'd like to share with you, so this month I will be focusing on connection, and next month, I will wrap up with a reflection on rest.

It is fitting, I believe, to focus on connection for the month of June, as Zach and I will be formalizing our connection to one another when we are married on June 22nd.

At the top of this article, I reference a small section of scripture from Ecclesiastes 4 that reads, "A threefold cord is not quickly broken." This, to me, speaks to the importance of nurturing the connections in our lives that are healthy and life-giving. The scripture speaks to how going through life separated from others can leave you vulnerable - emotionally, physically, mentally, and even spiritually. Like a single strand of twine, we cannot withstand much pressure before we snap. However, when we weave our lives together with others, our strand becomes a part of something much stronger. Unlike one strand of twine, when we wrap ourselves up in the support of loved ones and the strength of God, we become a part of a cord that is not so easily broken.



Nurturing the connections in our lives is a way of building up that cord and strengthening the fabric of our shared community. Two important areas of connection for me over the summer were reconnecting with myself and reconnecting with God in ways I hadn't nurtured as much as I would have liked. I've touched on these two topics in my other articles, and I will be focusing on both more in my July article. For this month; however, I want to focus on how I was able to nurture connections with family and friends.

Family was one area of connection I was able to lean into last summer, and the most important aspect of



that to me was spending time with Cora. Since her dad and I separated in October of 2021, I have wanted to do whatever I can to mitigate the burden of that decision on her. In any family who experiences divorce, the children involved often feel a LOT of mixed emotions as the process unfolds. Children can feel shame, anger, sorrow, confusion, relief, fear, and many other emotions swirling around within themselves. So many changes take place in the family, and the child(ren) involved have very little say in any of it. As her dad and I each struggled and adapted in the aftermath of our separation, Cora faced struggles of her own. Some of them stemmed from our divorce, and others came from different sources. Either way, her experiences and struggles aren't mine to share here, but I will say that the time I was able to focus on her, pour love into her, and connect with her over my sabbatical was a blessing for which I will always be grateful.

Over the course of the summer, I was also able to get to know Zach's friends and family. On a float trip, I was able to get to know friends from his youth that are basically family to him. In July, we traveled down to TX along with his sister, nephews, and their significant others. There, I was able to get to know his dad, step mom, and little sister. At the end of July, my side of the family went on our National Parks trip, and Zach was able to spend time connecting with my family, too. Throughout the summer, he and I were able to continue getting to know one another, learning shared values and hopes, and finding out how our strengths and weaknesses compliment and balance each other. On top of all this, sabbatical also allowed me the space and time to RE-connect with my closest friends. I was able to reacquaint myself with people who have been woven

into my support system for years and really invest time in nurturing those important relationship cords again.

As we move through this next month, I encourage you to join me in taking a look at the cord that binds you to family, friends, God, church, community, and beyond. In what ways are you nurturing the strands of your cord? In what ways might certain parts be fraying or pulling away? Are there parts of the cord that might need more or less attention? If you are a visual learner, it might be helpful to make a braided cord to remind you of the community into which you are woven. You could draw a cord or write down the names of different people or groups in your cord so that you remember to pray for them and nurture those bonds. I hope that each of you is able to name and nurture the sources of strength in your lives, and I pray that each of us is able to lean into the strength of our cord here at St. John as we grow together in our connection with one another and with God.


BOOK CLUB

CAMP FUND



- 3. Then you shall take the anointing oil and **anoint the tabernacle** and all that is in it and consecrate it and all its furniture, **so that it shall become holy.** Exodus 40:9.
- 4. Then you shall bring Aaron and his sons to the entrance of the tent of meeting and **wash them** with water and put on Aaron the sacred vestments, and you shall anoint him and consecrate him, so that he may serve me as priest. ¹⁴ You shall bring his sons also and put tunics on them ¹⁵ and anoint them, as you anointed their father. Exodus 40:12-15.
- 5. That they may serve me as priests; **their anointing shall admit them to a perpetual priesthood** throughout all their generations. Exodus 40:15
- 6. Then the cloud covered the tent of meeting, and the glory of the LORD filled the tabernacle.
