

Dearest Church Family,

As I write this, I'm in the midst of packing and getting ready for our vacation to Texas. You know how it is in the days leading up to a trip...there is a seemingly unending list of things that need to get done before the day arrives - do laundry, pack, tidy up, set up pet and plant care, etc. Once you finally have everything packed and you're pulling out of the driveway, there's a sense of relief. It's a good feeling to know all the hard work of packing is behind you and the days of rest lie ahead.

Rest is something we often associate with laziness. Every once in a while, we allow ourselves the luxury of rest, but even then, it can feel like there's something we could or should be doing instead. In our society that values output and achievement, it's easy to feel like any time devoted to rest is essentially wasted. It's time we could have done something, checked off something, or achieved something. We know logically that there are things we achieve by resting...but the benefits aren't immediately tangible. Because of this, when we rest, it can feel like we have nothing to show for it.

We're told in the story of creation that God rested on the 7th day. After creating the heavens, the earth, and everything that populates them, God set aside a day of rest, blessed it, and hallowed it. It doesn't say that God rested God's eyes for 20 minutes and called that rest. It doesn't say that God set about ticking off items on God's other to-do lists on this day of rest. Instead, it says, "He rested on the seventh day from ALL the work he had done." Of course, we aren't going to literally sit still in one spot for a whole 24 hours. But, we do need to reorient how we relate to rest so that we can follow God's example and experience the peace that comes with true rest.

Thankfully, this is something I was able to focus on during my sabbatical last summer. Because we know that it is difficult to allow ourselves rest, I'm very lucky to have a Spiritual Director who was able to help me lean into the practice. She gave me a couple points I could turn to when I was struggling with the spiritual practice of resting.

- When you are resting, you do not need to have something to show for it. You don't have to achieve anything measurable.
- You do not need to do something to "earn" the right to rest. Everyone needs and deserves times of rest.
- It can be helpful to schedule rest times on your calendar. This can mean setting alarms on your phone or putting in regularly scheduled appointments for rest in your calendar.
- Place a high value on rest. Often, we'll give up plans for rest for things that aren't pressing just so we can feel more productive.

Rest isn't just about sleep (although sleep IS a valid option). Rest is about refreshing and recharging yourself. That could mean spending time with God in prayer, going for a peaceful walk, reading a book, watching a show/movie you love, spending time with loved ones, or spending time alone. The list is endless, but the point is the same. Find the things that bring you rest, and be purposeful about making time for those things. God thinks it's important, so we will strive to make it an important part of our lives, too. May you all have a blessed and restful July!

Virtual services continue for those wishing to attend. We want to make worship as convenient as possible for our members and the community. Please see our website or our Facebook page for the Zoom link.


