- Here, we light the candle of Joy.

December 22:

- We Travel to Bethlehem: A Place of Humility
- Here, we light the candle of Love.
- We will hold our Brown Bag Christmas Pageant.

Christmas Eve:

- We Travel to the Manger: A Place of Care
- Here, we light the Christ Candle.

December 29:

- We Travel to Persia: A Place of Return
- Here, we will receive 'Star Words' to guide us in the year ahead.

Advent Fund Drive for the Snack Pack Program

This Advent Season, you are invited, once again, to help us feed the children of Clinton County by giving to our fund drive for the Clinton County Snack Pack program, which is run by our sister in Christ, and member of St. John UCC, Jenn Thompson. Her ministry helps to **feed 197 children** in Clinton County schools each weekend during the school year. These children receive free or reduced-price lunches through school during the week but are left without resources on the weekend. To help fill this hunger gap, the Snack Pack Program steps in and delivers shelf stable food that is either fully ready to eat or is simple enough for kids to prepare.

This vital ministry is not inexpensive. It costs \$17 each month to feed one child on the weekends, so it costs \$170 to feed one child for the 10 months of the whole school year. Total cost for the current students for this school year is \$33,490.

To help meet this need, St. John UCC is setting a goal to raise enough funds to sponsor

10 children (plus) for an entire school year. Last year we exceeded our goal so this year we have set a new goal to raise \$2,000 for the Snack Pack Program. To keep track of our progress each week, we will have a poster in worship with a Christmas Tree printed on it. Each week, we will place an ornament sticker on the tree for every \$20 dollars we've raised. Our goal is to have 100 ornaments on the tree by Christmas Day. We have our special gift box (see picture) next to our normal offering plate to receive your donations for this Fund Drive. Please make any checks out to St. John UCC and write Snack Pack in the memo line.



Together, we have the ability, the faith, and the heart to make a huge difference in the lives of 10+ children – God's children – in our community. I'm excited to see how we rise to this challenge and meet our goal together!


