

Beloved Church Family,

As we enter the month of March, we also begin our walk through the season of Lent. On Ash Wednesday, we enter this season of the Christian church that is often equated with self-reflection, fasting, and repentance. Historically, though, it has also been a time when the faithful have studied and prepared themselves to receive the sacrament of baptism or to reaffirm their baptism through the rite of Confirmation. This year, we will be combining these two areas of focus, as we take a deep dive into our baptismal promises. We will reflect on what our vows ask of us and how we might realign how we live out our faith with what God asks from us.

During baptism, we promise that we will "follow in the way of our Savior, resist oppression and evil, show love and *justice*, and to witness to the work and word of Jesus Christ." Our 2025 Lenten series, named "Roll Down, Justice", pulls from these promises and connects them to the teaching of the prophets and Jesus. As we remember the waters of baptism and what Amos called the rolling waters of Justice, we will journey through the 6 weeks of Lent together with open hearts and minds that are ready to be nourished in these waters. Hopefully, when we arrive at Easter, we will have a better understanding of what our Christian faith requires of us and how we might live that out in our world today.

Here is a road map of the Lenten journey that lies ahead.

#### Ash Wednesday – Make Me an Instrument of Peace: Re-cognition

- Repenting (turning around) from apathy and praying to be active instruments of peace.

#### Week One – Child of God: Naming Each One

- Through baptism, each one of us is named as a child of God.

#### Week Two - How Long?: Renouncing Evil

- Through our baptism, we are given the freedom and power to resist evil in all its forms as we put our whole trust in God.

#### Week Three – I Dream of a Church: Christ's Representatives

- We are reminded of our call to love others live as representatives of Christ in the world.

#### Week Four – I Choose Love: Communities of Forgiveness

- When someone is baptized, the whole community makes vows, too. We promise to be a community of love and forgiveness.

#### Week Five – God Has Work for Us to Do: Faithful Disciples

- Baptismal waters continue to feed the streams of justice when we allow the Spirit to work through our hands and feet, as we set about the work God has for us.

#### Week Six (Palm Sunday) – The Day is Coming: We Are One

- God's power is displayed through love and justice – not military might. We are called to love one another, not tear one another down.

#### **Maundy Thursday** – Traveling Companions: Journey to the Water

- We mourn when love is crucified on the cross of fear and hatred. (But, we know it is not the end of the story. There is hope.)

#### **Easter Sunday** – Welcome: The New Jerusalem

- We proclaim that justice does indeed roll down in a stream of love that cannot be stopped. No matter what, we will continue to work towards God's beautiful kin-dom!

I look forward to embarking on this journey with the church family of St. John UCC, and I hope we might all be renewed, refreshed, and re-inspired to let our hearts be tuned to the message of the Gospel.




# Virtual Worship Services Zoom
