

Beloved Church Family,

Since the birth of the Church over 2,000 years ago, communities of Christians have delighted in gathering together to celebrate their faith through worship and fellowship. We, at St. John UCC, are blessed to carry on this tradition in our own little corner of the Body of Christ. This April, in addition to our regular Sunday worship services and coffee hour, we have two special opportunities to be together as a church family. I would like to take this opportunity to personally invite each one of you to gather with us for both of them.

The first opportunity is a **Mid-Lenten worship service and meal**. In previous years,



we had tried to hold small Lenten worship services each Wednesday during Lent, but with busy schedules and smaller turnout, last year, we decided to try something new. Instead of six, small, weekly services, we'd have one, larger gathering in the middle of Lent. We had such a great time, that we're excited to hold it again this year. We will gather in the chapel at 6pm on April 2nd for a meal hosted by your worship committee (Bonnie, Laurie, and myself), and towards the end of the meal, we will join in a short service with some singing and prayers. It will be a great opportunity for everyone to take a night off in the kitchen, let someone else worry about cooking, enjoy the company of

your church family, and re-center yourself spiritually in the midst of busy lives and demanding schedules.

The other opportunity will be our Maundy Thursday service. We will be gathering at the church on Thursday, April 17th at 7pm, for a worshipful and meaningful journey through the story of Holy Week. Our worship will take place in three parts, and each part will tell the story of a different day in Holy Week. While we will be moving to a few different locations, we will allow plenty of time for each transition period, and there will be chairs at each place, so everyone can sit.

We will begin in the chapel, gathered in chairs around the altar. Here, we will experience the elements of Holy Week associated with Maundy Thursday. We will hear the story of the Last Supper and partake in the sacrament of Holy Communion together. We will also lift up Jesus' new commandment, as he said, "Love one another as I have loved vou."

> For the next part of the story, we will move outside the front entrance where we will hear the story of Jesus' arrest, trial, and crucifixion, which are all associated with Good Friday. Weather permitting, we will have a bonfire at this station, and we will each have the opportunity to put a dried palm leaf (representing our own mistakes and regrets) into the flames.

For the last part of the service, we will enter the sanctuary as we take a flame from the bonfire and light a candle on the altar. Here, we will remember the elements of Holy Week associated with the Saturday Vigil. It will be a quiet time for remembering our baptism and reflecting in prayer. It is sure to be a powerful service that will add meaning and depth to your Holy Week experience.

As we are told at the end of the second chapter of Acts, after the birth of the church on Pentecost, the believers devoted themselves to learning the teachings of Jesus, to the community, to their shared meals, and to their prayers. Today, on the other side of the world and years away from that first Pentecost, we continue this tradition in our little town of Trenton, IL. Thanks be to God for the continued opportunities we have to carry this torch of faith in the world today.
