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Beloved Church Family,


This past Sunday, I talked about a little-known church holiday known as "Rogation Sunday". The word "rogation" comes from a Latin word that means "To ask", and so it is a day in the life of the church when we ask for God to bless our fields and gardens, so that the work of our hands and the faith of our hearts might work together to bring a good harvest.

My grandpa, Kenneth, was a farmer. He grew up in a farming family in a small town in Wisconsin called Star Prairie, and after graduating, he joined the air force and moved to Scott Field, where he met my grandma, Doris, and got married. The two settled here, near my grandma's family, bought a farm between O'Fallon and Lebanon, and built their life together there. My mom grew up on the farm, and eventually I got to go there and spend time with my grandparents, sister, and cousins while my parents worked. In my earliest years, I was able to play hide and seek in the corn fields, pick wild blackberries, and "help" check the soybeans to see when they were ready to harvest.

My grandpa passed away in the spring of 1990 when I was about 4 and a half. But still, every year, neighbors would come and farm the ground for grandma. Every year, we got to watch the meticulous and intensive work that went into growing crops. Every year, we said silent prayers over the crops and the farmers. Every year, we held our breath as we waited for the crops to sprout, grow, and ripen.

Some folks might think it's rather bland living here in the Midwest. We don't have mountains, oceans, red rock arches, glaciers, or canyons, and goodness knows those things are breathtakingly beautiful to see. However, when I'm right here at home, and I catch a glimpse of the sunset over a field, I find myself pulling over, taking a deep breath, soaking in the beautiful work of God and his farmers.

And so, Creator God, we ask you to bless farmers, gardeners, field workers, and all who work alongside you to bring food from seed to plant and from harvest to table. Bless the water, sun, and soil that will feed and sustain each plant, and bless the harvest that will come. Thank you, God, for the beauty of fields, the faith of farmers, and the blessings they bring. Amen.


