Community is important. I have found this to be true throughout my life – especially when things get hard. Whether it's found among family or friends, at church or work, through sports or social clubs, or even online – community can be a literal lifesaver.

I remember, as a child, I had a difficult time among friends whenever I tried to explain the relationship I had with folks from church. I could be sharing a story from Sunday School or



coffee hour, or maybe I saw someone from church while I was at the mall with my friends. I would end up fumbling for words, as I tried to explain why this person from my congregation mattered. They were my mom's friends, my grandma's friends, or the parents of my church friends. They helped teach me about God and about life, they called me out when I was misbehaving, they celebrated my achievements, they pretended my clarinet solo during worship was PERFECTION, and they showed support when they knew something difficult was happening in my life. They felt like bonus family – people who weren't related to me by blood but acted as a close-knit network of support and encouragement.

Now, as an adult, I have the vocabulary for this, and it's something we talk about often. It's the church family. There is something wonderful and mysterious and healing about the community that comes together to form a congregation. It is a community that is delighted to see you whether you come to church once a year or every week. It's a group that cares about what is happening in your life and wants to know how they can support you. It is a place that transcends the social groups we find in the world. Whether you are sporty, creative, musical, talkative, quiet, curious, logical, intelligent, scatterbrained, or shy, there is a place for you at church. This hasn't always been the case at every church in every time and place...but it is something many churches (ours included) have been striving towards.

This scripture from Ecclesiastes speaks to this power of community. Whether it is a community of 2 or 2000, having a community you can reach out to can greatly improve your quality of life. It fosters a feeling of belonging, combats loneliness, offers opportunities for personal growth, benefits mental health, and cultivates a sense of identity and purpose.



The author of this scripture tells us, "A three-ply cord doesn't easily snap." I've used this scripture at weddings before to illustrate the power of partnership, but it is true for communities of all types. When we cultivate those connections and nurture our community bonds, we are weaving together cords that cannot easily be severed. These cords help to hold us together when the world feels like it is falling apart. They provide a safety net that promises to catch us when we stumble

or fall. They connect us like a tapestry and create something truly beautiful to behold.

You receive this monthly newsletter because you are a part of our community. You have, over the years, been woven into the fabric of our church family, and your thread adds to the strength and love we have today. You may have grown up at St. John, been confirmed or married here. You may have stepped in our doors as an adult, bringing a rich

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history of your own. Or church might be someplace that you turn to for connection each week, or we might be a place you've felt disconnection from in recent years. No matter what your connection is to our community, I want to take this opportunity to say thank you. Thank you for the contribution you have made to the communal fabric the people of this church have been weaving for 155 years. Your presence in this community makes a difference, and I thank God for you.
